GREEN TERROR BASEBALL NOTABLES

*According to school records baseball was the first intercollegiate sport played at Green Terror. Baseball came to the Hill in 1881. The Athletic Club of Western Maryland was organized in 1882 and in 1888 the Western Maryland Baseball Association was organized.

*May 19, 1933 Western Maryland played its first night game of record at George Washington University, beating GW 9-6.

*May 12, 1939 Western Maryland played its first doubleheader of record. American University at Western Maryland. WMC swept American University, 15-3 and 3-2.

*WMC's only known unassisted triple play:

Sunday, March 13, 1994 game vs. Rutgers Newark played in Cocoa, Florida during Spring Trip.

Runners on 1st and 2nd, no outs. Line drive caught by WMC 1st baseman Brian Van Deusen. He stepped on 1st for out #2 and ran to the bag at second touched it before the runner could get back for out #3.

*WMC's only known hit-for-the-cycle. March 9, 2002 vs. Lincoln, Ryan Shotzberger went 5 for 5 with 8 RBI's and scored 5 runs. He had a triple, HR (Grand Slam), Double and 2 Singles in that order. (Not bad for a day's work!)

*July 1, 2002, Green Terror became known as McDaniel College.
