The online graduation application for undergraduate students anticipating a May 2026 graduation is Nov. 15. Students need to submit their graduation application through Self-Service.

## **RESIDENCE LIFE**

The Office of Residence Life will open applications for the 2026-27 Resident Assistant (RA) position in January 2026. Students must have a 2.5 cumulative GPA, live on campus for a minimum of one semester, and be in good behavioral standing with the college.

RAs are responsible for cultivating a safe and engaging community in our residence halls. They create educational bulletin boards, plan social programs, facilitate roommate mediations, report maintenance concerns, and conduct rounds from 9 p.m. until midnight every night.

## **FINANCIAL AID TEAM**

The <u>Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)</u> for the 2026-27 academic year is now open! Even though the fall 2025 semester has just started, we recommend that you and your student submit your 2026-27 FAFSA as soon as possible and check it off your list. Filing the FAFSA early helps secure priority consideration for financial aid and enables families to plan with accurate financial information.

If your student is a Maryland resident, please note that this past year, the Maryland Higher Education Commission (MHEC) only awarded funds to students who submitted their FAFSA and MHEC One App by the March 1 deadline. State scholarships and grants are limited, and MHEC will only distribute funds until they are exhausted.

#### **Policy Highlights of the Month:**

#### **Housing Updates**

Students' financial aid eligibility is directly tied to their housing status. If your student decides to change their housing status from living on campus to commuting or vice versa, they must complete a Housing Update Form with the Financial Aid Office.

Here's what to know:

- Students moving from resident to commuter status will see a reduction in their McDaniel aid, since the cost of attendance decreases.
- Federal or private loans may also be adjusted when housing status changes.

We strongly recommend that students consult with the Financial Aid Office before finalizing any changes to their housing arrangements, so they can understand how these changes may impact their aid package.

#### **Important Changes to Parent PLUS Loans**

Congress recently passed new federal legislation (referred to as the "One Big Beautiful Bill Act") that introduces several significant changes to federal financial aid programs. These updates affect both students and parents, and while many families may not be directly impacted immediately, it's important to be aware of how these changes could shape your financial planning for college.

One of the most notable updates regarding the Parent PLUS Loan program is the introduction of the Parent PLUS Loan Cap. Families are now limited to a lifetime borrowing cap of \$65,000 per student. The average Parent PLUS loan at McDaniel in 2024 was \$18,000, so many families will stay below this limit. However, families whose PLUS loans exceed this average should keep this new cap in mind when planning for the remaining costs of their student's undergraduate education.

## THE BURSAR'S OFFICE

#### IMPORTANT NOTICE: REFUNDS VIA DIRECT DEPOSIT ONLY

- Students received instructions on how to set up direct deposit through PayMyTuition.
- If the refund is from a Parent PLUS loan and is not going to the student, the parent must also set up direct deposit.
  - The student must designate the parent as an authorized user through PayMyTuition, for this to happen.

#### REMINDER: REVIEW STUDENT STATEMENT MONTHLY

- Check your student account regularly to ensure your balance is paid in full.
- Nov. 1: Final fall payment plan installment is due.
- Nov. 3: Spring registration opens, and the account must be in good financial standing to register.

#### **SPRING 2026 SEMESTER**

Spring statements will be available on Monday, Nov. 17, and payment plans for spring also open that day, with the first installment due upon enrollment. Installment amounts are based on your enrollment date in the plan. The last day to enroll in the payment plan option is Jan. 5, 2026. There is a \$75 enrollment fee.

The additional payment plan installment dates are:

#### LOOKING AHEAD TO IMPORTANT DATES FOR SUMMER AND FALL 2026

June 15 - Fall payment plan enrollment opens. The first installment is due at the time of enrollment. Installment amounts are based on your enrollment date.

Installments are due: July 1, Aug.1, Sept. 1, Oct. 1, and Nov. 1. There is a \$75 enrollment fee.

#### **Professional Pathways**

Why does McDaniel College use professional pathways for career development? Grouping college majors into professional pathways helps students make clearer connections between their academic studies and potential career outcomes. This approach simplifies career exploration by organizing majors around shared industries or roles, making it easier for students to see how different disciplines can lead to similar professional opportunities. It also encourages interdisciplinary thinking and collaboration, reflecting the way employers often hire based on skills and interests rather than specific degrees. Overall, professional pathways create a more intuitive, inclusive, and strategic framework for career development.

## **CAMPUS SAFETY**

October is National Crime Prevention Month, a time to highlight the importance of safety and awareness. At McDaniel, we not only recognize the value of crime prevention but also promote the supportive measures in place to help keep our students and employees safe.

As part of our commitment, the Annual Security and Fire Safety (Clery Act) Report is now available.

Here are some key crime prevention and safety tips to help protect your student and support the well-being of our entire campus community:

- Always carry a cell phone or other communication device with you when you are out by yourself.
- Update your contact information for McDaniel Alert messages.
- If you go walking or running, always do so in well-populated areas and during daylight hours, and avoid walking in alleys and poorly lit areas off campus.
- Always lock your vehicle and never leave items in your vehicle in plain view.
- Park in well-lit areas. The college routinely assesses parking lot and campus lighting to maintain a well-lit campus.
- Always lock your residence hall, house, or apartment room door.
- Do not prop open any doors to campus residences.

Happy fall! We hope you are enjoying the season and all the opportunities it brings to connect with your student. October is **Relationship Violence Awareness Month**, and we want to share some helpful information so you feel prepared to recognize the signs of unhealthy relationships and know how to offer support.

As parents and family members, it's natural to worry about the challenges college students face as they build new relationships. Abuse can take many forms — physical, emotional, verbal, or psychological — and each can have a lasting impact. Some warning signs to watch for include:

- Sudden changes in mood or behavior
- Withdrawal or isolation from friends and family
- · Lower self-esteem or loss of confidence
- Excuses for a partner's unhealthy behavior
- Expressions of fear, stress, or anxiety

If you notice these signs, approach the situation with empathy and understanding. Create a safe, non-judgmental space for your student to share their feelings. Rather than criticizing their partner, focus on expressing your care, concern, and support. Please encourage your student to make their own decisions while reminding them that they deserve respect and kindness in every relationship.

Resources are available to help. McDaniel's Wellness Center is a key support on campus, and national resources like <u>Love Is Respect</u> also provide valuable guidance.

We know it can be deeply stressful to suspect that someone you love may be experiencing harm. Please remember to take care of yourself, too.


